Role Title

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT WARDEN

Purpose of the role

Playing an important part in our Reserves Team, you will help with the delivery of all aspects
of DWT's practical estate management; gaining experience in a variety of aspects of nature
conservation.

Type of work the role will be involved with

- Gaining experience with the broad range of practical management predominantly on DWT's South Dorset Nature Reserves and, at times, other DWT nature reserves.
- Developing experience with support from DWT staff in involving and supervising groups and individuals in site management. Gaining skills maintaining the reserve's estate fabric, including boardwalks, gates, fences and tracks.
- Gaining skills in species surveying such as butterfly, reptile and dormouse surveys.

Skills and abilities you will be using in your role.

- Friendly, outgoing personality with good communication skills.
- Keen interest in wildlife.
- You will need to be enthusiastic and flexible in the role and able to react to the changing demands.
- You will need to be physically fit and willing to work outdoors in all weathers.

Times / days we would like you to be available (minimum time commitment)

 Ideally 1 day a week and preferably the same day each week (although there is some flexibility)

- Opportunity to gain experience in engaging people in nature conservation and managing visitors on sensitive sites.
- Opportunities to engage with the DWT's work across South and East Dorset, including management of nature reserves, community engagement, surveys and helping at other centres.
