Type of work the role will be involved with:

Avon Wildlife Trust is the largest local charity working to protect wildlife in the West of England area (formerly the County of Avon - Bristol, Bath and North East Somerset, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire). We care for more than 30 nature reserves, from ancient bluebell woods to Iron Age forts, nationally important wetlands, and wildflower meadows. We run awardwinning educational and community programmes and we work with landowners in the wider countryside, to reduce the decline in wildlife by creating a Living Landscape.

This placement will be based at Grow Wilder. This Avon Wildlife Trust 12 acre site is a community hub that champions wildlife gardening, sustainable food growing and land management. We run wildflower nursery from the site which is a platform for learning, engaging community groups and managing different habitats across the site. It a place where people and wildlife thrive in a productive setting.

The trainee will learn about:

- Working with and leading volunteers from a wide range of backgrounds
- Urban conservation and wildlife-friendly food growing
- Managing the wildflower nursery and living seedbanks
- Community engagement and wellbeing programmes
- Wild play and outdoor learning

- Fencing and reserve infrastructure work
